2021 survey of subscribers to IWH products: results

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INTRODUCTION

In May 2021, the Institute for Work & Health (IWH) conducted a survey of subscribers to its communications products to gauge the level of trust in, and use of, IWH research and information.

SURVEY METHODS

The survey questions were developed by the Institute's Executive Committee. The resulting four-question survey, developed in Qualtrics, took under three minutes to complete (see Appendix A for the survey questions).

Subscribers to three IWH products — IWH News, At Work and IWH Speaker Series invitations—were invited to complete the survey, representing 7,140 stakeholders.


Through the Institute's Contact Relations Manager (CRM), subscribers were sent an email on May 3, 2021, from the Director of Communications, inviting them to take part in the survey by clicking on the link included in the email. A reminder email was sent a week later (May 10) and a final reminder two weeks after that (May 19), letting people know the survey was closing the next day.

Of the 7,140 email invitations to stakeholders, 42 asked to be unsubscribed, 43 bounced (i.e. emails no longer valid) and 10 indicated out of office in response to all three emails. Subtracting these from the total emails sent left 7,045 subscribers that are assumed to have received the survey invitation (i.e. the denominator).

In the end, 1,063 people clicked on the survey link—440 in response to the first invitation, 373 in response to the second, and 250 in response to the third.

The resulting response rate was 15.1 per cent. However, not all questions were answered by all survey respondents; 827 answered all questions, 160 provided partial responses and 76 responses were blank. In total, 987 people answered some or all of the questions, resulting in a response rate of 13.8 per cent.





A total of 578 respondents described how they shared information from IWH. Their open-ended responses were grouped into one of nine categories, as shown in the chart below. Note that 66 respondents indicated that they shared our information in more than one way.


